SkillsUSA members nationwide are encouraged to apply for the SkillsUSA-Aerotek "Make Your Mark" scholarship. The scholarship is for SkillsUSA members who expect direct educational costs for the Spring 2024 term at a community college, technical college or apprenticeship program. All applications must be

submitted by **Nov. 27**. Selected applicants will receive up to \$5,000 toward tuition, books, tools, oncampus housing and other approved direct educational expenses.
